### School of Kinesiology and Health Science

**Applications are invited for the following five (5) positions:**

• Assistant Professor, Professorial Stream in Applied Cardiovascular Physiology (e.g., effect of aging on cardiovascular health, lifespan changes in cardiovascular health, and exercise prescription for cardiovascular health).

• Assistant Professor, Professorial Stream in Physical Culture, Policy and Sustainable Development (e.g., critical socio-cultural study of physical culture, policy and sustainable development).

• Assistant Professor, Teaching Stream in Physical Activity Studies-Physical/Movement Literacy (capacity to integrate theory and practice into physical literacy teaching, learning and program design).
